Accomplishments	The Steve Palermo Foundation for Spinal Cord Injuries (SPF/SCI). A family foundation began in 1992 to fund research to discover a cure for paralysis. Also provides hope/ support to those with spinal cord injuries and their families. The SPF/SCI merged with the Kent Waldrep National Paralysis Foundation in 1995 and continued to 2003. Seeking to continue the work the Foundation created, the Palermos formed a partnership with University of Kansas Endowment Association. The Steve Palermo Nerve Regeneration Laboratory now resides in the Life Sciences Innovation Center at KU Medical Center. The same drive and dedication that returned Palermo to his feet fuels the efforts of this laboratory to aid in discovery of a cure for paralysis. Testified in 1993 in front of the Congressional Healthcare Committee, urging for the inclusion of physical rehabilitation within any basic healthcare insurance plan. Commissioner – White House Tee Ball Game on South Lawn, 2005. The event marked the 15th anniversary of The Americans with Disabilities Act, a milestone in the nation's quest to guarantee the civil rights of all citizens.
